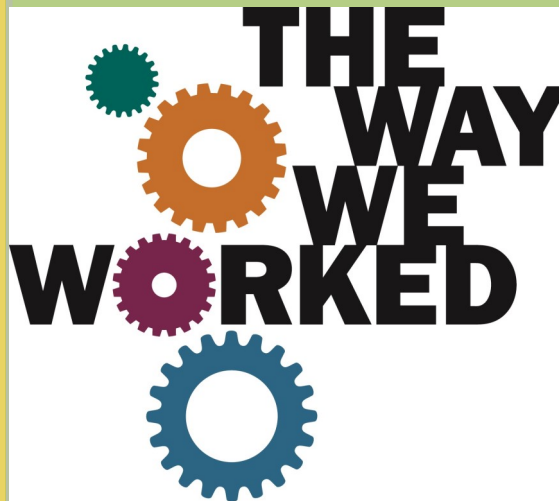

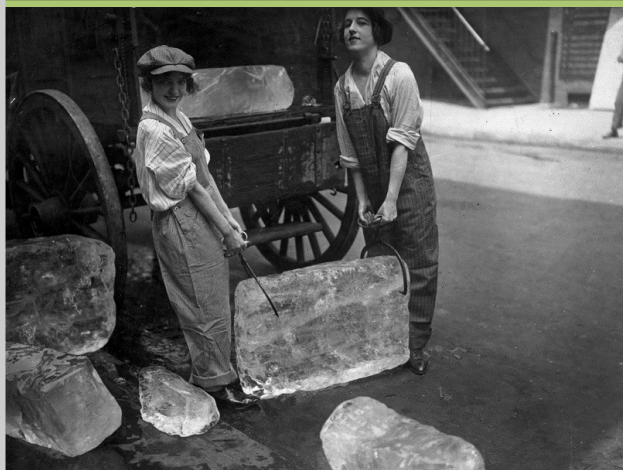
This exhibition from the Smithsonian Institution explores how work became such a central element in American culture by tracing the many changes that have affected the workforce and work environments over the past 150 years.
